Please mark donations for district matching or the church building fund.



Happy New Year

Whew! 2024 is finally behind us. And I think it would be an understatement to say that none of us expected all of the things that happened in 2024.\ I know I certainly didn't anticipate an indoor waterfall on the Friday after Thanksgiving. None of us expected the challenges of having a roof replaced that we are still dealing with.

I am an optimist at heart. There is nothing we can do about what has happened. Mike Cavin said to me once, as my DS, "I love history, I've studied history. But I didn't major in history." That was his advice to me for dealing with people who were less than satisfied with all of the things that had happened. It has been close to 20 years ago now that Mike gave that advice and it's still good.

I would never have chosen to remodel the church, the way it is happening! But, since it is happening that way, we can either complain about it or we can embrace it and figure out how to make 2025 the best year, Summerville First United Methodist Church has ever had.

Some of you are no doubt already laughing at my foolishness or think I've lost my mind, or at the very least think I don't understand the seriousness of our problem. I can assure you, I am well aware of where we are.

More importantly, I know who we are. We are the church visible in Summerville, Georgia. We have been called by Christ to be witnesses to the kingdom of God right here right now. Many of you will think that you are too old for what is coming or that you are not qualified for what is about to happen. You're too old for fantasies or fairytales.

There's a word I learned in seminary, actually, it's a phrase Tabula Rasa, in English it just means blank slate. And that's what we're being given here in Summerville right now. We're about to have a new set of rooms to use for the glory of God. As we do this, we can update those rooms in ways that would not have been possible or practical if we hadn't had the flood. I hope we take advantage of the opportunity to upgrade those rooms.

The physical upgrades are secondary. What we have is an opportunity to show our community who we actually are. We are God's chosen people. Christmas is immediately behind us and we are reminded that Christ was born into the world for us. Easter is going to be relatively early this year and it's important to remember that the reason Christ came into the world was so that he could sacrifice himself in

our place. As sisters and brothers in Christ, we are part of the family of God. I'm proud of my last name, and the heritage that it comes with, but that does not compare to being part of the family of God.

Knowing who we are, and where we are, we can faithfully begin or continue, however you want to look at it, our journey to where we are going. Where are we going? One of those other phrases I learned in seminary is that we are all moving on to perfection!

Lastly, we know who is going on this journey with us. I may have mentioned before, Dossie was given a book several years ago by the author Stormie Omartian. The title was, "Just Enough Light for the Step I'm On. I will also confess that I wish God gave me a little bit more light, so that I could see a little farther down the road. But truthfully, as I look backward over my ministerial life, if I had been given too much information, I might have run screaming from the room. There were too many times in my ministry, that I was not ready for more light.

Romans 8:31 says, "If God is for us, who can be against us?"

I've said, I know who we are, I know where we are going, and I know who is going with us. The question for us in 2025 is, what road are we going to take to get there? I have ideas about where the church is going and they are positive. With the challenges that are in front of us, we need to focus our energies and our activities on two or three big things that we can do. Not saying we're not going to do other things I'm saying we need to focus our time, our money, and our energy in the places that we can have the most impact.
