February is the month we celebrate Valentine's Day. So, happy Valentine's Day.

What is Valentine's Day all about? Obviously love. What is Christianity all about? Same answer. It is also not enough to "hate the sin" and "love the sinner". It might surprise you to note that this phrase doesn't appear in the Bible. It's probably from Saint Augustine but regardless, Jesus, nor anyone else in the Bible ever said it.

What Jesus did say was that we were to love our enemies and pray for people who persecute us. I will be the first one to admit that that's hard. Sometimes impossibly hard. That is our challenge. Jesus also said to his disciples, right before he left this earth, "a new command I give you, love one another as I have loved you. Everyone will know you are my disciples **if** you love one another". We represent Jesus to the world. All of us know "Christians", who, for lack of a better word are hateful. I put Christians in quotes because I don't believe they're actually followers of Christ. I do not believe you can be hateful and a Christian.

The gospel of John says that "God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten son". In his letter to the church at Rome, Paul says that no one is righteous, not even one person. No one understands God, no one seeks God, all have turned away, all have become worthless, no one does good at all.

Can you wrap your mind around the fact that God loved us, even when we hated Him. That is why the expression says that If God didn't love His enemies, He wouldn't be able to love anyone.

In another letter, Paul says, "For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith, and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God, not by works, so that no one can boast. Grace, the unmerited favor of God, is a gift. You cannot earn it. Faith is a gift, God gives us the ability to believe Jesus died for us. Therefore, salvation itself is a gift.

How did and does Jesus love? A woman caught in the act of adultery would be sentenced to death. Yet, Jesus did not condemn her. To make the long story short, Jesus waited until ALL of her accusers left. He asked her where they were, she said no one who accused her was left. Jesus said He didn't accuse her either, go and sin no more. No anger, no hatred of her sin, just "go and don't do it anymore".

The Jews of Jesus' day were willing to accept anyone who was exactly like them. Jesus accepted anyone who was sincerely seeking God. Roman Centurions, Canaanites, tax collectors, Samaritans. All were accepted by Jesus.

Loving like Jesus means giving up on our prejudices and favorites. We do not have to endorse everything someone does to love them.

February is the month we celebrate love. Let's learn to love like Jesus.
